The State University, Lexington, Ky., offers the following courses, namely: Agricultural, Mechanical Engineering, Civil Engineering, Electrical Engineering, Mining Engineering, Chemical and seven Scientific courses, each of which extends over four years and leads to a Bachelor's degree; also a Department of Law and a Department of Education, which has been established instead of the Normal School.
