GENERAL NEWS.

A dentist of Edinburgh has patented an ingenious modification of forceps which admits artificially cooled air through its points to the gum, so as to deaden sensation previously to the extraction of the tooth, and thus rendering the operation painless.

The Messrs Winans of Baltimore, have received a renewal of their contract from the the Russian Government, for remounting and keeping in good order, all the movable machinery and cars on the Nicoll Railway, from St. Petersburg to Moscow, a distance of about 600 miles.

Hon. Jacob Callamer, United States Senator from Vermont, and who held the position of Postmaster General in President Taylor's Cabinet, died at Woodstock, Vt., on the 5th Nov., aged seventy-three years.
