Sunday Services in Winn

The services at the Episcopal Church were attended both morning and evening. In the morning, the Rev. Mr. ... preached on the "Divine Unity" of the church, taking his text the words found in the 13:12, "By one Spirit are we baptized into one body." He showed that the church is a body made up of various parts and the true working of the church depended upon the harmonious adjustment of these parts. In speaking of the kingdom of God, he showed that it was in its meaning than any mere organization or denomination. The various churches are a federation of the units of intellectual and social concepts of the world and naturally they drift toward a common center. The leading thought was that the church as well as elsewhere must be the unity of purpose and recognition of the common methods, thought and purpose. The law governing this registration is very plain, making it necessary that every voter shall register before participating in any election after January 1, 1909. The people of Winn parish should avail themselves of the opportunity to register as an election is likely to occur on local questions at any time and they would be debarred from participating by not having registered.

Attend to this duty today and retain your right of suffrage. The vote of Winn parish should easily be carried to the two thousand mark and with the power thus vested in the people there would be no question of their ruling.
