CHARTER OF THE Verdunville Club.

UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, STATE OF LOUISIANA, PARISH OF ST. MARY.

Before me, James R. Parkerson, a Notary Public, duly commissioned and qualified within and for the Parish of St. Mary, State of Louisiana, in presence of the witnesses hereinafter named and undersigned:

Personally came and appeared the parties whose names are hereunto subscribed, all residents of the Parish of St. Mary, State of Louisiana, who declared that they have and do hereby organize themselves and all parties and persons who may hereafter become associated with them into a body politic in law, for social and literary purposes, and in accordance with the provisions of the laws of this State, affecting such corporations, have and do hereby adopt the following charter, to-wit:

ARTICLE I.

The name of this corporation shall be the "VERDUNVILLE CLUB" and its domicile shall be at Verdunville, in the Parish of St. Mary, State of Louisiana, and all legal process shall be served on the President, and in his absence upon the Vice-President.

ARTICLE II.

The objects and purposes of this corporation are the cultivation and promotion of literary and science and the encouragement of closer and social relations and intercourse among its members. And to effect these objects and purposes, the said corporation shall have, possess and enjoy and exercise all the rights, powers and privileges of a corporate body for the term and period of ninety-nine years from the date of this act.

ARTICLE III.

The business of this corporation shall be conducted and governed by a Board of Directors composed of the President, Vice President, Secretary-Treasurer, and five members of the corporation, and all legal process shall be served upon the President, and in his absence on the Vice-President as aforesaid.

ARTICLE IV.

The officers and directors of this corporation shall be elected annually at a meeting held for that purpose on the first Sunday in August of each year, notice of which meeting to be given or printed notice mailed to each member of the corporation ten days prior thereto by the Secretary-Treasurer or other officer of the corporation.

The first Board of Directors shall consist of Albert Mayer, H. Mandeborg, Philip Hill, Thomas Pratt and John Hernandez. Albert Mayer shall be President, Philip Hill, Vice President, and N. Mandeborg, Secretary-Treasurer. All of the above named directors, Vice President, President, Secretary-Treasurer shall serve as a Board of Directors, and also in their precluded capacities from this date until their successors shall have been elected on the First Sunday in the month of August, 1912.

ARTICLE V.

This corporation is authorized to lease, purchase, convey, hold and mortgage such real estate and property in the Parish of St. Mary, as it may deem necessary for the objects and purposes of this corporation. It may adopt by-laws, rules and regulations, and alter, amend or abrogate the same at pleasure, except as hereinafter provided, and generally to possess such powers as are incident to a corporation, and necessary to carry out the purposes for which it was organized.

ARTICLE VI.

The Board of Directors shall have the power to regulate the manner of assessing and collecting such initiation fees, dues and fines as may be prescribed by the by-laws or authorized by this corporation.

ARTICLE VII.

This charter may be amended at any regular or special meeting called for that purpose, after fifteen days notice by mail to each member, by a vote of two-thirds of all members present at such meeting, and the corporation may be dissolved at a special meeting held for that purpose after thirty days notice mailed to each member by an officer of this corporation, to be cast either in person or by written proxy.

ARTICLE VIII.

No member of this corporation shall ever be held liable or responsible for the debts, contracts, obligations or faults of this corporation, beyond the amount of any dues or assessments which he may owe for the current year.

ARTICLE IX.

In the event of the dissolution of this corporation by limitation or otherwise, its affairs shall be liquidated by three commissioners to be appointed by the Board of Directors for that purpose.
