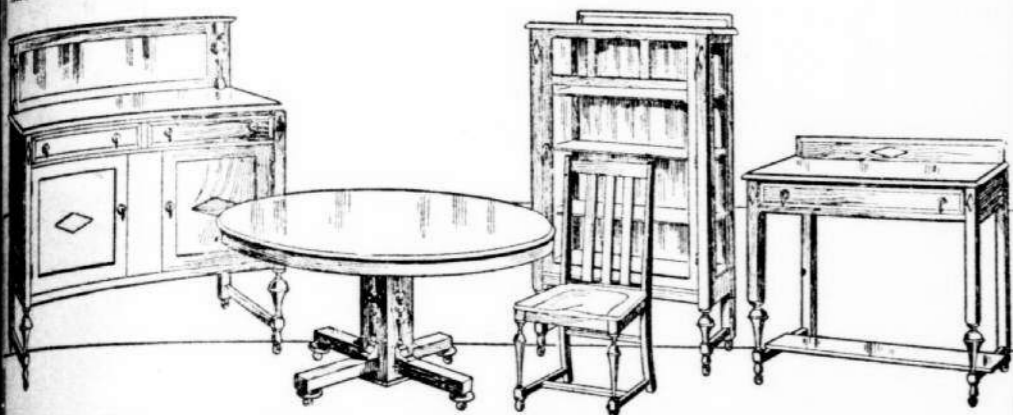

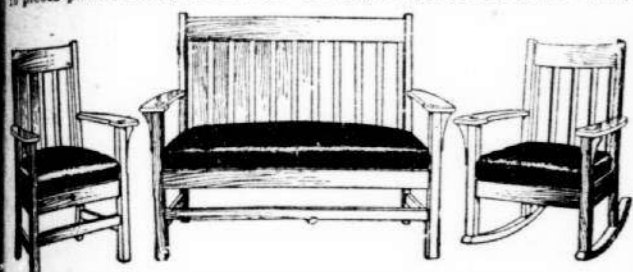

FRANK KRAEMER HURT.

With One Hand Cut Off, He Fires Pistol in Call for Help.

While hunting for box car thieves shortly after midnight Wednesday morning, Patrolman Frank Kraemer, 47 years old, of the Harbor Precinct, met with a serious accident. He was walking along the Louisville and Nashville tracks between St. Louis and Conti streets, going to Canal. A switch engine, coming from behind, struck him and threw him some distance forward. In falling his right hand fell across the track and the engine cut it off at the wrist.

The crew did not see the policeman, and were unaware that the engine had struck a man, so they continued their run to the yards at the head of Julia street.

Luckily, Kraemer did not lose consciousness or he might have bled to death. With his right hand he managed to get out his pistol and fired five shots to attract attention and help. The shots were heard by employees in the Public Belt roundhouse. They found the injured policeman and sent him to the Charity hospital.

GUilty OF LARCENY.

Junius Coleman, alias William Mitchell, pleaded guilty in the Second City Court Thursday morning on two charges of larceny, and was sentenced by Judge O'Donnell to serve ninety days in the parish prison.

Patrolman William Bell charged Coleman with stealing a bicycle belonging to Milton Burg from 334 Bermuda street, and two locks, the property of Frank Lecourt, on April 15. Coleman was given sixty days on the first charge and thirty on the second. Coleman, who is eighteen years old and Joseph Auguste, aged 13 years, were caught in the act of breaking open stalls in the Foto Market last week. The stalls of D. Suseri, A. Kerstens and Ernest Lucien had been broken open, but only a half dozen oranges were stolen; \$2.50 damage was done. Coleman is in the parish prison, while his boy companion was sent to the colored wail's home.
