Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Section 15 H, of Chapter 206 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1898 be and the same hereby is made applicable to Calvert County and St. Mary's County, anything in said Act to the contrary notwithstanding.

Section 2. Be it enacted, That any of the Public Local Laws of Calvert County or St. Mary's County be and the same are hereby repealed in so far as they may be inconsistent with Section 15 H, of Chapter 206 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1898.

Section 3. And be it enacted, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 407.

ROADS.

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact with Amendments Sections 100 to 103 both inclusive of Article 19 of the Code of Public Local Laws title "St. Mary's County," sub-title "Roads," as amended by Chapter 354 of the Acts of 1902, and to repeal Sections 103 A to 103 F both inclusive of said Article under said Title and Sub-title.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Sections 100 to 103, both inclusive, of Article 19 of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "St. Mary's County," sub-title "Roads," as amended by Chapter 354 of the Acts of 1902 be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 100. The County Commissioners are hereby authorized and empowered to purchase in such manner and on such terms as they may deem best, the interest of the County, five miles for each of the three Commission District of the County, to be used in operating the three road machines now belonging to said County, and for other purposes in repairing said roads, they shall make provision for the feeding and proper care of said mules, and at the conclusion of general road work in each and every year, they may in their discretion place said mules in the custody of such persons as will properly care for them at the least expense to the County.

Section 101. The County Commissioners shall at their first meeting in May, Nineteen Hundred and Four and annually thereafter, appoint as many Road Supervisors for each election district and precinct of the County as they may deem necessary for the proper working of said Roads, said Supervisors in all cases being selected with special regard to their knowledge and skill in directing Road work, and shall be subject at all times to such rules and regulations as may be adopted by the County Commissioners with regard to the repairing, mending and perfecting the public roads of said County; the said Commissioners shall also fix the compensation of Road Supervisors and the per diem of all laborers employed to work on said Road.

Section 102. The County Commissioners shall provide in their levy of 1904, a sufficient sum of money to pay all indebtedness on account of Roads and shall then and annually thereafter levy a sum not less than five thousand nor more than eight thousand dollars for the building and repair of said Roads in any one year; provided that nothing in this Section shall prevent the Commissioners from levying an additional amount to build any bridge, the cost of which will be one hundred dollars or more.

Section 103. The County Commissioners shall so soon after each annual levy as practicable apportion the sum so levied for Public Roads among the several Election Districts and precincts of the County in exact proportion to the assessed basis of each district and precinct, they shall as far as practicable, have all Road work done in a permanent manner.

Section 2. And be it enacted, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage, and that all Acts and parts of Acts inconsistent with this Act, be and the same are hereby expressly repealed.

CHAPTER 358.

GAME LAW.

AN ACT for the better protection of game birds, song birds, insectivorous birds in St. Mary's County.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Section 15 H, of Chapter 206 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1898, be and the same hereby is made applicable to St. Mary's County, anything in said Act to the contrary notwithstanding, and that Section 1 of Chapter 588 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1892, be repealed and re-enacted so as to read as follows:

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That it shall be unlawful for any person in St. Mary's County to shoot, kill or catch, or in any manner to entrap or ensnare any partridge or quail in said County between the 24th day of December and the first day of November, nor any woodcock between the twenty-fourth day of February and the fourth day of July, nor any rabbit between the fifteenth day of January and the first day of November of each year.

Section 2. Be it enacted, That any of the Public Local Laws of St. Mary's County be, and the same hereby are repealed in so far as they may be inconsistent with Section 15 H, of Chapter 206, of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1898.

Section 3. And be it enacted, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

OYSTERS.

AN ACT to regulate the taking or catching of oysters in the Patuxent River and its tributaries within the waters of Calvert, Charles and St. Mary's counties and in the tributaries of the Potomac River within Charles and St. Mary's counties and in the waters of Dorchester county and the Choptank River.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That it shall be unlawful for any person, or any person or persons to take or catch oysters in any manner whatever in any of the waters of the Patuxent River and its tributaries in St. Mary's, Charles and Calvert counties, or in the tributaries of the Potomac River lying in St. Mary's and Charles counties, between the first day of April and the first day of October in each year, or in the waters of Dorchester county or the Choptank River in said County, between the twenty-fifth day of April and the fifteenth day of September in each year, provided, however, that nothing in this Act shall be construed as to prevent any person or persons from taking or catching oysters on private beds or taking oysters from private beds for private use during the closed season, but not for sale in the open market.

Section 2. And be it enacted, That after the passage of this Act, any bona fide citizen of St. Mary's, Charles and Calvert counties, who shall have procured a license from the Justice of the Peace of the county in which he is a bona fide resident as prescribed in the General Law of the State of Maryland, shall be permitted to use such license to take or catch oysters in the Chesapeake Bay, or in the Potomac River, or in any of its tributaries, and he is authorized to allow to be taken in said waters in conformity with the General Oyster Law of the State, and they shall be subject to all of the provisions and penalties prescribed by the General Oyster Law of the State of Maryland.

Section 3. And be it enacted, That the Clerks of the Circuit Courts of St. Mary's, Charles and Calvert counties, are authorized by this Act to issue a license to any bona fide resident of their respective counties to take or catch oysters, and shall charge the same fees for the issuing of such license, as is provided for in the General Oyster Law of the State, and for the privilege of taking oysters during a full oyster season in any one year, and said license shall permit such licensee to take or catch oysters in the Chesapeake Bay, or in the Potomac River, or in any of its tributaries, at any time that oysters are allowed to be taken in said Chesapeake Bay and Potomac River, under the provisions of the General Oyster Law of the State, and they shall be permitted to use the same in the same manner and for the same purposes as are provided for in the General Oyster Law of the State.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Sections 59 to 79 inclusive of Article 19 of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "St. Mary's County," be and the same are hereby repealed, and that the same be re-enacted, with amendments, Sections 73 and 74 of Article 19 of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "St. Mary's County," sub-title "Leopardtown," and to change the name of the corporation mentioned therein.

Section 2. And be it enacted, That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
