What the Country Cows and Dairy Farms Produce in a Year.

At a meeting of the Sussex county, N. Y., farmers held at Deckertown, on the 8th of March, an interesting statistical paper on the dairy interests was read—from which it is

dairy interests was read—from which it is learned:

"That it requires 15,000,000 cows to supply the demand for milk and its products in this country and that the capital invested in the dairying business is over \$2,000,000,000. It requires the cultivation of over 60,000,000 acres of land to furnish food for the above number of cows. More than \$200,000,000 are invested in dairy machinery and implements alone. The men employed number 700,000 and 1,000,000 horses are necessary.—The cows and horses consume annually 30,000,000 tons of hay, 90,000,000 bushels of cornmeal and same amount of oatmeal, 275,000,000 bushels of oats, 2,000,000 bushels of bran and 30,000,000 bushels of corn, to say nothing of the brewery grains and questionable feed of various kinds that is used all over the country. It costs \$168,000,000, or an average of \$20 a month per capita. The annual yield of the average cow is placed at 450 gallons, making the total milk product 6,750,000,000 gallons a year. The farmers' receipts for this milk, averaging it at 12 cents a gailon, amount to \$810,000,000. Cheese and butter use up 50 per cent. of the milk yield. To make a pound of cheese ten pounds of milk are required, and twenty-seven pounds of milk make one of butter.—The comparative nutritive qualities of milk is as three and one-half pounds to one pound of prime beef. A fat steer furnishes 50 per cent. of boneless beef, but it would require about 24,000,000 steers, weighing 1,500 pounds each, to produce the same amount of nutrition as the 15,000,000 cows supply with their each, to produce the same amount of nutri-tion as the 15,000,000 cows supply with their annual yield of milk."


