Old Prison Ordered Closed. The fortress of San Juan de Ulua, notorious for centuries as perhaps the foulest prison on the American continent, has been ordered by Rear Admiral Jethel to be completely vacated immediately.

When the American sailors and marines occupied Vera Cruz there were in this prison, which is constructed in the form of a little island in the harbor, some 400 prisoners, most of them confined for political offenses.

Terrific Conditions Prevailed. The inspection of the prison by the American authorities verified the tales that had been written and told for generations of the terrible conditions prevailing there.

The release of prisoners from the waterlogged dungeons was a revelation of the character and the attitude of the United States.

GRAY GLAD VETS TO MEET AGAIN

25,000 Visitors Expected at Jacksonville Next Week

Jacksonville, Fla., April 29.—All arrangements have been completed for the twenty-fourth annual national encampment of the United States Confederate Veterans, which will be held in this city next week.

For nearly a year, a committee of fifty of the foremost citizens of Jacksonville has been at work on the preparations for the reception and entertainment of the 25,000 or more visitors who are expected to be here from every part of the south.

Already public buildings and private residences are taking on holiday attire in honor of the coming of the grizzled heroes. The electrical decorations will be the most elaborate ever seen in the south.

Only One Surviving General. Gen. Bennett H. Young of Louisville, commander-in-chief of the United Confederate Veterans, will preside at the business sessions of that body.

The annual parade will be the closing feature of the reunion. Many of the old soldiers who composed the armies of Virginia and Tennessee, who marched to the strains of "Dixie" and followed the old flag under Lee and Jackson and Hood and Johnson, are now too feeble to march in the ranks with their comrades.
