Common Council met in regular session at clerk's office on above date.

Present, E. B. Green president, and trustees Hawkins, Smith, Montigel, Bagley, Tinker; absent, Pulfrey.

Minutes of council meeting held Aug. 21st read and approved.

On motion the sidewalk in front of premises of John Hicks, L. G. Holliday and Edd Berry on Superior street was ordered repaired. Voted on as follows: Yeas, trustees Hawkins, Smith, Montigel, Bagley, Tinker—vote announced and declared carried.

Moved by trustee Smith and supported by trustee Hawkins that a new sidewalk be and that the same is hereby ordered constructed twelve feet wide in front of premises of J. M. Montigel & Co., described as lot six (6) of block twenty-three, Alma. Vote, yeas, trustees Hawkins, Smith, Montigel, Bagley and Tinker—vote announced and declared carried.

Trustee Smith reports that W. S. Turck refuses to give village addition of ground for highway on Ely street, at present owing to want of time in construction of new fence, etc., this fall.

On motion Wright, Schneider & Stutz were instructed to complete sidewalk in front of grist mill at once.

Vote, yeas, Hawkins, Smith, Montigel, Bagley, Tinker—vote announced and declared carried.

On motion James Gargett was instructed to abate nuisance on premises near creamery arising from waste of water from flowing well.

On motion commissioner was instructed to issue duplicate order to Peter Fechting in place of one lost.

On motion council adjourned.
