Moved and seconded that the Clerk be instructed to make any necessary repairs in his office and to purchase coal stove and coal for the same. Carried.

Resolved, that H. J. Hughitt, County Treasurer, be notified by the Clerk to produce a statement at the next meeting of the board showing all moneys received and disbursed, where received from and how paid out.
