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WOULD REVISE THE CALENDAR

THIRTEEN MONTHS IN EACH YEAR IS PROPOSAL TO COME UP AT BIG CONFERENCE, AT GENEVA.

There will be a conference of all nations next summer at Geneva, Switzerland, to discuss suggestions for an international perpetual calendar.

At that time Lorry S. Boyd will present his calendar, which has 12 months of 28 days each, making a total of 284 days in the year.

The additional month is called Solaris and comes between June and July. As an illustration, the year 1916 is used, because according to the present calendar, the first day of that year will begin on Saturday, which would become New Year's day, Sunday, be known as Jan. 1, 1916.

Such a perpetual calendar would make it unnecessary to have a printed calendar for every month, because the days of each month are identical with those of the first month.

ROMANCE OF ROYAL WINE.

Bottle of "Mud" at London Auction Was Imperial Tokay.

The auction sale room has furnished many little romances, and now one has fallen to the lot of the wine trade.

The catalogue afforded no clue as to its character, for it was described as "Fifteen dozen of Moselle" (which it most certainly was not).

The mysterious lot was knocked down to the bidder, whose curiosity was aroused at 10 shillings per dozen, and after consulting with his principals the opinion was formed that it might be some of the royal imperial tokay which is the exclusive property of the emperor of Austria.

It was estimated that the original quantity which the vendor possessed was an aum or cask of 20 millions. It would when bottled make the specified 15 dozen, and allow for about a dozen bottles containing the lees or sediment, one of which was no doubt the sample submitted at the sale.

The consignment was brought up from Bats, and a special sitting of the directors of the firm, the manager and the expert taster was held. In solemn silence a bottle was uncorked, and the wine—pale and brilliantly clear—was unanimously pronounced to be the royal tokay, the trade value of which is not less than a guinea and half a bottle.

No doubt the original owner was some diplomatist to whom the wine had been given as a mark of imperial favor.—London Daily Chronicle.
