MOVIES MADE FROM U-BOAT

Supersubmarine Captures Ship and Uses It for a Tow Boat.

(Correspondence of the Associated Press.) CHRISTIANA, Norway, May 29.—Moving picture operators on German supersubmarines at sea are late additions to the U-boat fleets. Films are made of merchant vessel sinkings and taken home to be shown to the German populace to give an idea of the dangers of the deep.

Details of how a German submarine of the larger type commanded by the big Norwegian steamer Norefos and used her as a tow boat for weeks at a time in the Atlantic were related here recently by members of her crew.

The Norefos was overtaken by the German submarine off the Canary Islands early this year. Two German naval officers and fourteen sailors were sent aboard as a prize boat crew.

Then the submarine departed on a pirating expedition, the Germans on the Norefos adjusting the wireless apparatus so as to be able to keep in communication with the undersea boat. On this trip the submarine was gone eight days and upon her return to the Norefos the sailors heard that she had been in search of a British fleet of merchantmen from the other side of the Atlantic.

The submarine then tied up to the Norefos and for two weeks the Norefos roamed the sea with the submarine in tow, as the U-boat was short of fuel.

The Norefos soon ran short of fuel and an effort was made to utilize green peanuts from the cargo, but they soon developed a gas which caused numerous small explosions in the fire boxes and created such a stream of sparks through the funnel that the ship nearly caught fire. So no more peanuts were used and for several days the Norefos wallowed along with the wind and tide. When other ships were sighted the Germans unfurled the Norwegian flag.

After another two weeks' cruise the U-boat returned to her "mother" ship.

After helping themselves to a part of the cargo of rubber, the prize crew returned to the supersubmarine, the Norwegians were ordered into lifeboats, and the Norefos was sunk by three bombs exploded in her hold. The motion picture operator on the U-boat took film records of all the important events, starting with the seizure and the developments of the voyage with each return of the U-boat to the ship. The Norwegian sailors were in lifeboats several days, being picked up by a French steamer and several weeks ago they arrived in Christiania after an absence of five months.

HOW TO KILL GRASSHOPPERS

Poison Bran Mash Recommended as Means of Controlling Pest.

Swarms of grasshoppers have been reported as doing considerable damage to field, truck and garden crops in Missouri. They may continue to do injury to crops until late fall unless measures are adopted for their control.

The grasshoppers may be effectively and cheaply destroyed by sowing poison bran mash over the infested fields. This poison mash is made as follows: Mix thoroughly in a tub or half barrel, 25 pounds of wheat bran and 1 pound of paris green. In a separate receptacle mix 3 1/2 gallons of water 2 quarts of molasses or syrup, and the juice and finally ground pulp and skin of 4 oranges or lemons. Add this mixture to the wheat bran and paris green and mix thoroughly. A moist, coarse, crumbly mixture is desired.

It should not be sloppy and it should be made up fresh for each sowing. The above proportions will sow four or five acres.

For the best results the poison bran should be sown over the field before sunrise, in strips from 12 to 15 feet wide. It is usually advisable to sow the poison bran along the fence rows or weed and grass grown ravines from which the hoppers emerge during the early morning hours. If it is sown broadcast there is no danger of poisoning birds or live stock. The grasshoppers are usually killed in from six to eight hours after eating the poison. The young insects are much easier killed than the old ones, hence the importance of applying the poison bran now.
