## DEATHS

**ANNA LEE BENNETT**, the little daughter of Mr. and Mrs. C. A. Bennett, died at the home of her parents in Highland addition at 2 a. m. last Thursday, Nov. 23d of yellow jaundice after an illness of several days, aged 3 years, eight months and 17 days.

### Charles Logan Scott Dead.

Charles Logan Scott was born June 20, 1886, and died Nov. 18, 1911—aged 25 years, 4 months and 28 days. He was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Leonard Scott, and was one of a family of seven girls
