### IN BENTIGHT AFRICA.

STANLEY proves the Nile to be 4,100 miles long. The prickly pear is overrunning and destroying some of the best and most fertile lands in South Africa.

According to Captain Wissman, of the African exploring party, the paradise of birds seems to have been found on the shores of a lagoon communicating with the eastern extremity of the Albert Nyana.

The British South Africa Company, it is reported, has proposed to its employers that any servant discovering a mine in the country covered by the company's charter will be made a co-proprietor of it with the company.

Of the 11,003,950 square miles of Africa, only about 4,500,000 remain which have not been claimed by some European power, and more than half of this area lies within the desert of Sahara; France has taken 703,000 square miles, Germany 743,000 square miles, and England has a controlling influence over 1,000,000 square miles.

It is proposed to cut 503 to 1,000 steel tubular frame eight wheel wagons, fitted with automatic brakes, on the Government railways in Natal, and that they shall be paid for by one-half the annual savings made by using them in moving freight, as compared with the cost of moving an equal quantity on ordinary wagons.

GERHARD ROHLFS, the African explorer, expresses the opinion that the Trans-Sahara railway could be built only after the complete disarming of all the nomads through whose territory the route would lie. For this purpose twenty thousand picked soldiers would be necessary. One of the greatest obstacles in the way of the constructors, Herr Rohlf's says, would be the sand banks. The largest of these banks might be tunneled, he thinks, while others might be made through the smaller ones.

In many localities sand shovels, built after the plan of the American Malabar, would be necessary. Malabar fever is the one sad certainty which every African traveler must face. Its geographical distribution is still unmapped, but generally it prevails over the whole east and west coasts within the tropical limit, all along the river courses, on the shores of the inland lakes and all low-lying and marshy districts. The African malaria spares no man; the strong fall as the weak; no number of precautions can provide against it; no kind of cure can do more than make the attacks less frequent; no prediction can be made beforehand as to which regions are haunted by it and which are safe.

It is reported from South Africa that the Barotse, who live on the upper Zambesi, have accepted the protection of Great Britain, and an immense territory, embracing about two hundred and twenty-five thousand square miles, has thus been added to the dominion of that Nation. These natives live above the famous Victoria falls, on the north side of the Zambesi river. Their King is said to have agreed to abolish the killing of witches and the custom of human sacrifices, which have been of every-day occurrence. Nothing of importance is done among the Barotse without a sacrifice, generally a child. Hardly a day passes but some man is burnt to death on the charge of witchcraft.

### APPLES IN APETIZING ARRAY.

A DISH OF SNOW.—One pint of stewed, strained, sweetened apple flavored with rose-water. Add the whites of two well-beaten eggs. Eat cold with cream.

FANCY APPLE PIE.—Stew, strain and sweeten apple to taste. When cold add three eggs to a pint of apple, a teaspoonful of cream, whipped. Beat all together and bake in one crust.

APPLE OMELET.—Five eggs beaten separately, two tablespoonsful of milk, two tablespoonsful of sugar. Fry in omelet-pan. As soon as it sets spread with apple sauce and turn over in half.

APPLE SNOBALLS.—One cupful of boiled rice. Bring small clothes out of hot water, lay over a bowl, spread the rice on thinly, put a pared and cored apple in the center, tie the cloth together and steam.

CHARLOTTE DE POMME.—Grate ten sour apples, mix with two cupfuls of sugar. Line a dish with slices of sponge cake, turn in the apples, make a hole in the middle and fill with currant jelly. Put into a mold and set on ice. Turn out in a dish and cover the top with slices of sponge cake.

FLOATING ISLAND OF APPLES.—Bake nine apples; when cold, sift. Beat in enough sugar to sweeten. Add the whites of five eggs, flavor with rose-water, mix until light and heap on cold boiled custard made from the five yolks of the eggs, a cupful of sugar, a pinch of salt and one quart of milk.

SLICED APPLE-DEMPLES.—Invert a trapezium in the pudding-dish, fill with sliced apples, sugar to taste, crust.—Two cupsful of flour, two teaspoonfuls of baking powder, large spoonful of butter, stir with a spoon, roll out, cover the dish, making a hole for the escape of steam. Bake, steam or boil.
