Receipts of cattle thus far this week are 45,100; last week 43,200; last year 45,000. Monday's market was strong for best offerings of all classes and today with choice beef steers scarce; values held firm, although medium kinds ruled steady to weak. Good and medium cows sold at steady rates; canners slow. For choice stockers and feeders the inquiry was brisk at firm to 10c higher figures; others unchanged. Bulls steady; veals strong.
