Joplin has established a truant school to which semi-incorrigible children of all ages are sent. One of the best rural teachers of Jasper county has been employed to control and teach the school. It will doubtless be a typical Flat Creek school and will take more than an old fashioned "Hoosier Schoolmaster" to manage it. The experiment will be watched with interest. If the experiment proves a success, other cities will do likewise.

The State Department of Education is doing all it can to straighten the work of the rural

schools. One means of doing this is to build up first-class small high schools and have the nearby rural schools articulate with them. There is little prospect of establishing a large number of rural high schools in Missouri. The boys and girls living on the farms should complete a good common school course in their home districts and then attend the best high school near their homes.
