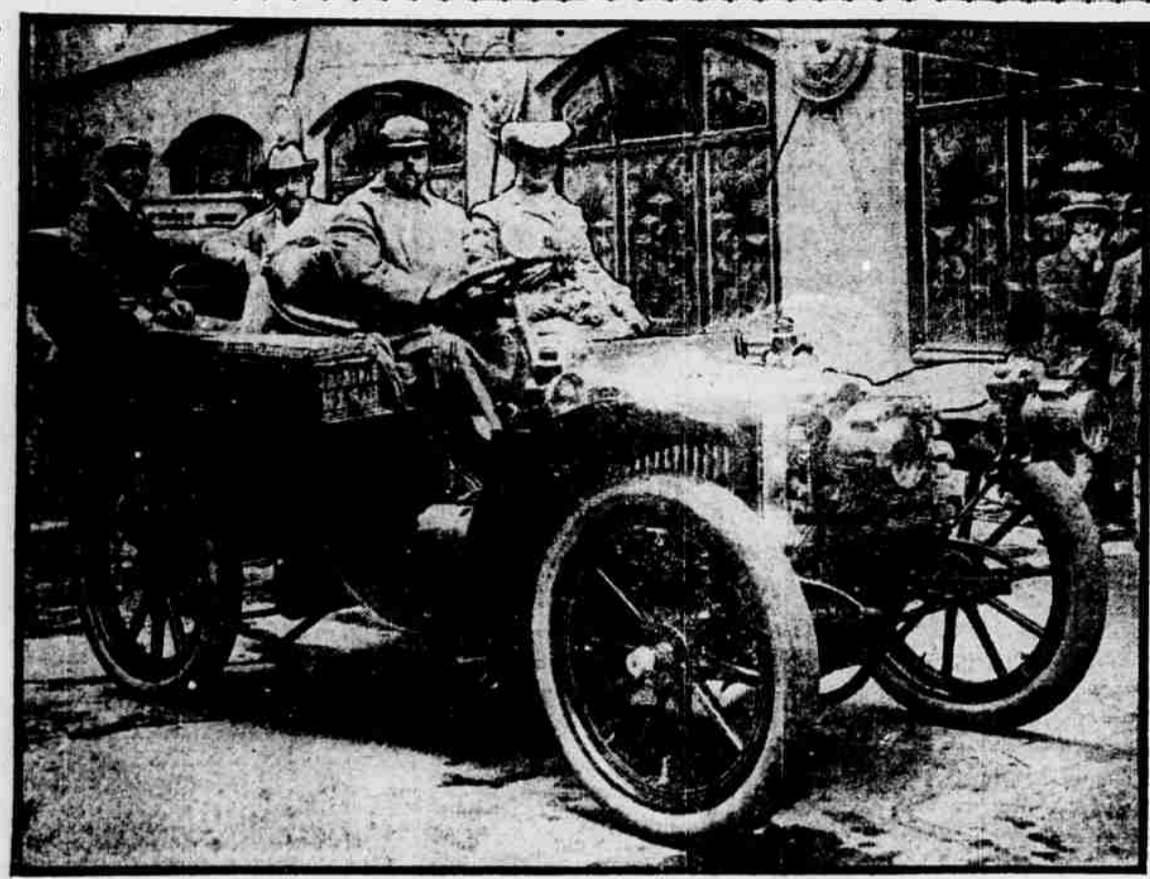

FAST TRAIN FALLS THROUGH BRIDGE

Between Thirty and Fifty Persons Reported Drowned Near Pinon, Colo.

RELIEF SENT IN HASTE.

Operator Who First Reaches Scene Reports Hearing Cries of Distress, but Cannot Find Engine and Three Cars.

REPUBLIC SPECIAL. Pueblo, Colo., Aug. 7.—At 7:30 o'clock word was received at the local offices of the Missouri Pacific and Denver and Rio Grande road that train No. 11, the Missouri Pacific "Flyer," which left Denver at 5 o'clock this afternoon, consisting of an engine and five coaches, had gone through the bridge near Pinon, Colo., eighteen miles from this city. It is reported that between thirty and fifty persons were drowned.

At 9 o'clock a relief train, consisting of the wrecker, four coaches and a baggage car, carrying Assistant Superintendent Miller of the D. & R. G. and Superintendent K. H. Bowers of the Missouri Pacific and several surgeons, started for the scene. Owing to the fact that wires are down near the point of the wreck, no details at that time could be learned.
