SEEKS TO INDICT INSURANCE MEN

Merchants' Association of New York Thinks Crime Has Been Done.

CAMPAIGN GIFTS UNFAIR.

District Attorney and Attorney General Called Upon to Prosecute the Law—Other Suits in Prospect.

New York, Oct. 12.—The Merchants' Association of New York, through its Board of Directors, today adopted resolutions upon the District Attorney of New York. The resolutions are directed against the practice of the insurance companies who have contributed to the State Attorney General's office for the purpose of procuring political campaign committees.

In addition to the adoption of the resolutions, the Merchants' Association would be requested to consider his determination not to ask for an extraordinary session of the Grand Jury to consider the matter.

The resolutions, in part, are as follows: "Whereas, in the judgment of this board, the money expended for political purposes, especially for the purpose of procuring political campaign committees, is an unjust and unfair use of the funds of every description; and

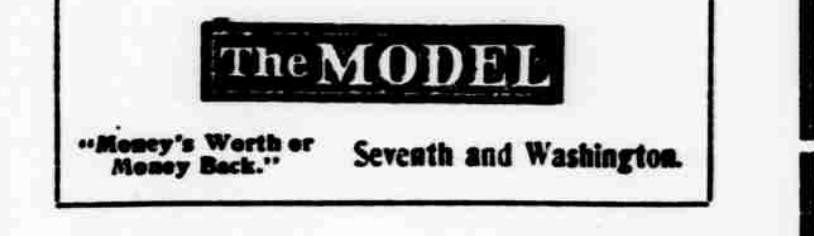
