We have been in session eleven days; we have subpoenaed two hundred and seventy-one witnesses; we have examined three hundred and nine witnesses; and in all we have returned in open court seventy true bills.

The practice of miscegenation upon which we received a special charge to inquire into, we believe to be on the increase. We have received promise from parties thought to be guilty of said offense that their habits would be changed for the better.

The reports as to the public thoroughfares of the county, are in the main satisfactory. We would call the attention of the Board of Supervisors of the county to the following, to wit: that they see that the materials that are furnished road overseers are used, and that they check all such materials by the vouchers furnished with the accounts against the county.
