Constitutionality of the Civil Rights Law. At the last session of the Civil Rights law provides for a review by the Supreme Court of all cases arising under the law, and that without reference to the case in controversy, there is very little doubt that a case will soon go up for the decision of that high tribunal. Referring to the subject the Mobile Register says: The Republicans in Congress took precious good care that the Civil Rights bill should come before the Supreme Court as soon as possible and be speedily forever. The question of the constitutionality of the law is now the most interesting and important point in the controversy. Senator Carpenter, who spoke and voted against the bill, predicted that the Supreme Court will hold the law to be unconstitutional; and, when a question of constitutionality is involved, Senator Carpenter is certainly high authority and likely to be right. It would not be surprising if the first test case on the question should go up from the North; for while the number of people in the North who now deny any of the political rights of the negro is very small, the number of those who entertain social prejudices is still very large.
