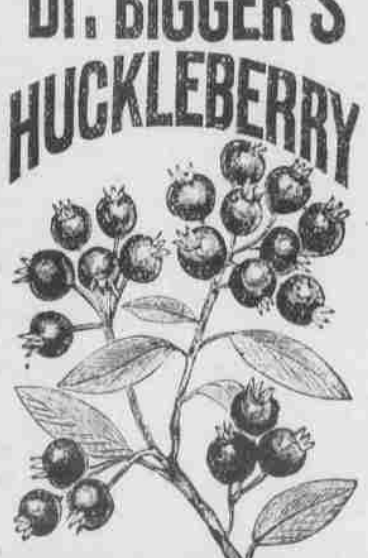

WESTMINSTER, B. C., June 15.--The city of Vancouver, situated at the Pacific end of the Canadian Pacific railway, is in ashes, not half a dozen houses remain out of five hundred, and the worst of all there is a large loss of life.
