Something of Interest.

We will shortly send out statements to each one of our subscribers. These accounts will be made out up to date, thus giving those who wish it, an opportunity of paying their accounts in full and taking advantage of the cash price of \$1.50. It makes us tired when we have to tell people who let their accounts run from one to several years that they cannot settle at the rate of \$1.50 per year. If that is all you wish to pay, give it to us in advance. See newspaper law in this issue and remember that stopping your paper doesn't settle your account. The only exception made in sending out these bills will be those paying in advance. It will be useless to get mad and say you can pay your account without being asked for it. The trouble is you do not pay it when we need it. The scarcity of money this year has hurt us as badly as it did any one else, still we complained but little, and until recently asked no one for money. If you did not intend paying promptly, why did you take the paper? Last year a number of our subscribers failed to pay because their taxes were so high. This year they will come in, some of them, and swear by all the dead gods of Greece, and two or three of the most prominent goddesses, that they not only paid up, but paid in advance for several years. You managed to pay your taxes last year. You can raise the same surplus this year and hand it over to us. Some fail to pay for their paper so long that when their account is presented they dispute it and have nothing to argue from but a defective memory. We are tired and weary of that old racket, I paid Mr. Brewer. If at least half of our delinquents do not pay up we will not be able next year to give it to the other half. Every man should therefore re-pay his account so that we can continue to furnish the paper free to his neighbor. In concluding we will state that while we do not wish to enter suit against any one, we need money and must have that which is ours. To you, individually, it is a few paltry dollars, but to us it runs way up into the hundreds.

On Monday of last week, the baby girl of Mr. and Mrs. Chas. Dixon, while alone for a few minutes in the house, got too near the fire and was severely burned, from the effects of which it died Tuesday. The little one was only 18 months old. Its mother, who was preparing supper, heard its screams and running into the room caught it up and smothered the fire. It did not seem to be so badly burned and complained but little up to Tuesday night. The burial services were conducted by Rev. R. J. Stewart at the residence of Mr. A. T. Avery, near town, on Thursday 16th inst., and was attended by a number of persons from Liberty and vicinity. The sympathy of many friends is extended the family in their hours of sorrow.

We have just been informed that Mr. Levy, of Summit, spent a night in this county, several weeks ago, and the next morning discovered that his horse's tail had been trimmed and completely shaved during the night. Such acts of vandalism will be attended to in the hereafter, as there seems to be no way of getting at them in this county. We hear that the old gentleman is of the opinion that the White Cap race is not yet extinct.

The Fair. The Amite, Franklin and Wilkinson Fair Association held its first exhibit at Gloster on Friday last. Quite a number attended and the exhibits were good. Hon. W. F. Love delivered an excellent address, dwelling on the advantages of a diversification of crops, which was received with rounds of applause. The people were much encouraged at the opening and immediately began to talk of erecting a building and buying grounds for exhibition purposes. The school children were invited and attended in the evening in a body. They numbered 210. The exhibit continued on Saturday. There were all varieties of field and garden products, fancy work, art exhibits from the school, fruit, wine, butter, poultry and live stock of all kinds.
