### For Religious Freedom

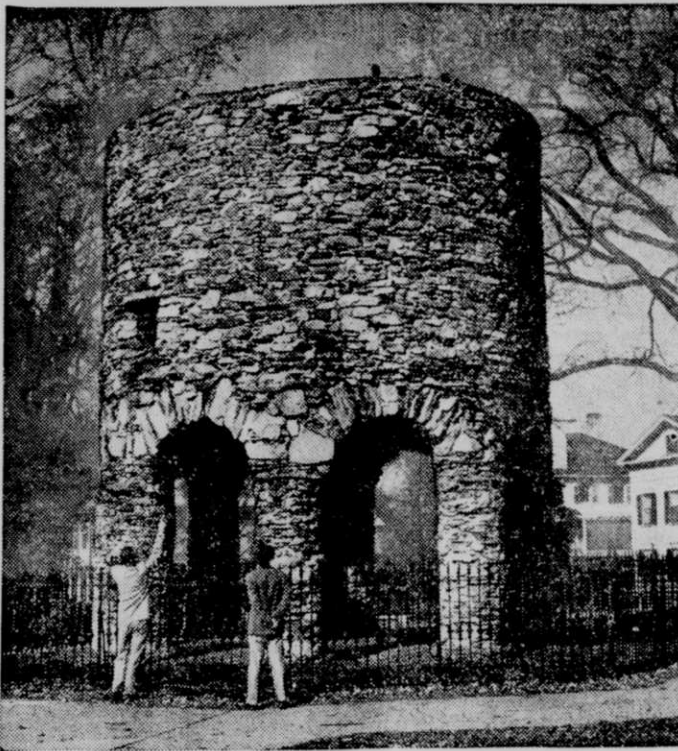
Pennsylvania was practicing religious freedom a century before America generally accepted the idea and welcomed persons of any creed when "witches" were being burned and non-conformists hanged.

The Athletics of Philadelphia won the National league pennant in 1871 by forfeits



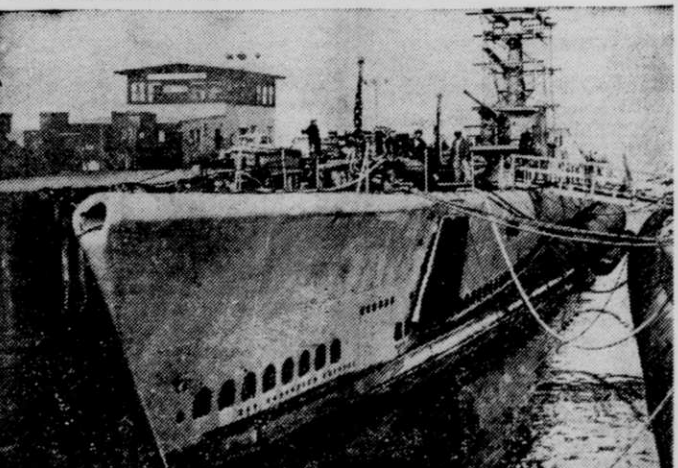
