**GREAT NORTHERN
HEADS ON VISIT**

Jenks and O'Neill in City Friday;
Will Return From Butte
This Evening.

A party of Great Northern officials, headed by Vice President C. O. Jenks and James O'Neill, general manager of the road's western territory, stopped in Great Falls a short time Friday afternoon while en route to Butte on an inspection trip over this division. The officials were joined here by General Superintendent W. R. Smith, Division Superintendent Fred Wear, John Dowling, general superintendent of motive power; A. B. Ford, master mechanic, and Oscar Bowen, chief engineer of the territory west of Whitefish. The party will return to Great Falls this (Saturday) evening and intend to spend Sunday in the city. Superintendent Wear stated that neither Mr. Jenks nor Mr. O'Neill had as yet outlined local activities incident to the Great Northern's decision to make large expenditures in the maintenance of way department, but that information of a definite

nature would probably be obtained before their departure. "Mr. Jenks and Mr. O'Neill are going over the line on their regular spring check-up trip," said the superintendent, "and while here will probably indicate new work to be undertaken this season in the maintenance of way and operating departments. They will return to Great Falls Saturday night to remain over Sunday and it is possible that an announcement of some interest will be made while they are here."

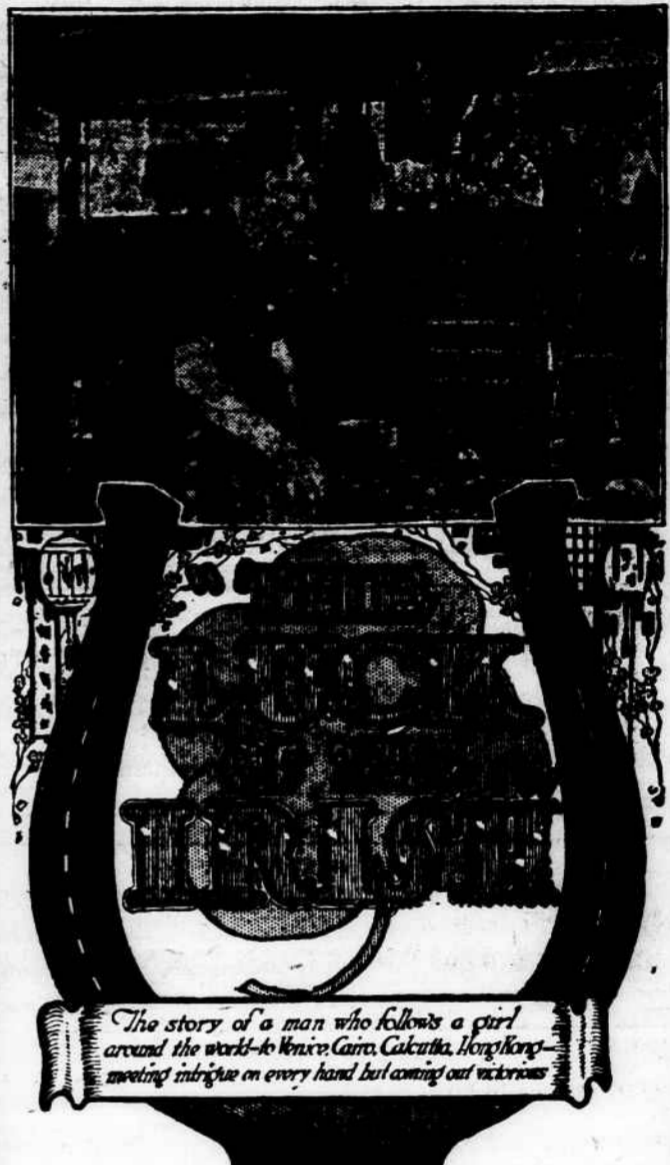

**CHENOWETH PAYS
FINE AND CHECKS**

Then Is Started for Idaho to
Answer to Charge of Grand
Larceny.

M. F. Chenoweth, arrested at Helena on a bad check charge preferred by Strain brothers store and also wanted at Pocatello, Idaho, in connection with the theft of an automobile, admitted the accuracy of the store's complaint in the Earl Justice court Friday, and was fined \$20 and released when he produced the cash and made good the check. Three other dishonored checks were paid by Chenoweth after his return from Helena, the total amounting to \$140 in addition to the fine. Chenoweth was identified as the man wanted at Pocatello by Deputy Sheriff W. E. Splan, who gained from the suspect the admission that the stolen automobile had been left in Butte as security for a small loan. Chenoweth is said to have admitted that he and a man named Henry took the car in the Idaho city and on the strength of his

statement Henry also located at Helena, was arrested. Deputy Sheriff Wheeler of Pocatello took Chenoweth in charge after he had appeared in court Friday and left on an afternoon train for Helena, where Henry will be picked up and with Chenoweth returned to Idaho.
