ASBURY PARK, N. J., Jan. 16. Rev. Edward S. Young, pastor of Westminster church, was seen last night regarding the report that Dr. McGlynn was in danger of assassination when he spoke here last August.

"I learned from Secretary Venter," said the doctor, "that a clerical-looking man in the audience had made threats against Dr. McGlynn. Chief of Police Bailey was notified and we had also a volunteer force ready to seize the stranger in case he made any move to attack the speaker.
