RAILROAD PANIC.

Reading and Northern Pacific Stock Knocked About in Reckless Style.

Charges of Extravagance and Mismanagement Claimed to have been the Cause of the Trouble.

NEW YORK, Feb. 20. The third day of the great battle between masked foes in Reading territory opened on the stock exchange...

On the spacious floor of the exchange the groups which trade in Reading and Northern Pacific adjoin each other. Long before the opening the brokers began to gather in these groups...

There was very little of the chaffing and badinage often present before the opening. All felt that today was no time for joking...

The moment the exchange was opened for business huge blocks of Reading were thrown on the market, and inside of twelve minutes the price was hammered down 6 1/2 points...

It was a panic. Brokers literally tumbled over each other in their wild eagerness to unload. Reading was thrown on the market in big blocks...

dropped away in a panic fashion. This was due to the publication of the report of the stockholders' examining committee, calling attention to the extravagance and mismanagement of the directors.

The report was, of course, cabled to London, and the effect was seen today in the London market, where the stock was quoted 3 points below its closing price here.

It closed here on Saturday at 48 1/2, and opened this morning at 43 1/2. The excitement in the stock was second only to that in Reading, and the panicky feeling was just as strong.
