

BOARD OF EQUALIZATION PROCEEDINGS

At 2 o'clock p. m. August 11th, 1919, board of equalization resumed. All members of the board and clerk present.

Affidavit of Chas. E. Behner of Glasgow presented to the board stating that he is the owner of 1,263.8 acres of land in Valley county, that said tract contains 190 acres of land which is tillable, the remainder being poor grazing land and prays that the board may reduce assessment from \$15,000 to \$11,058, the full and true value of the said land. On motion, assessment of Chas. E. Behner is hereby ordered reduced from \$15,000 to \$11,058.

Affidavit of Wesley W.
