HOW GERMS GET INTO THE BODY

(By Honora Costigan) Germs may enter the body through 48 the lining of the mouth, the lining of the bronchial tubes, digestive tractalso through openings in the skin, cuts and insect bites.

It is because of this fact that the habit of putting unclean fingers into the mouth is a very dangerous one. Coins which have circulated from one person to another in all kinds of coaditions should never be put into the mouth. Pencils also are dangerous carriers of germs-especially among school children who put them into their mouths-not knowing where the pencil 75 has just been.

The use of the common drinking cup is also very dangerous. A crack or cold sore on the lips may afford a very fine place for a germ to enter. No one ever knows who used the drinking cup last, or what disease that person may have.

It was found that the mosquito was the means of introducing the germ of malaria into the bodies of our men who were working in the Panama some. Yellow fever, too, was found to be caused by insects. The bite of flea that feeds on the dead bodies of rats which have died of the bubonic plague, has caused the deaths of thousands of people.

CIVIL SERVICE EXAM.

The United States civil service commission announces a clerk-carrier examination on March 13, 1920, to establish an eligible register from which selections may be made to fill vacancies as they may occur in the pomitions of clerk and carrier, post office service, Glasgow, Montana. Salary, 92 \$1000 per annum plus bonus for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1920.

Age limits: 18 to 45 years on the .17 date of the examination. Age himits and height and weight requirements do not apply to persons entitled to preference because of military or .04 naval service. Both men and women will be admitted to the examination. Application blank and information can be obtained by applying to the

board of civil service examiners, at Glasgow, Montana; or to the sec-retary, Eleventh U. S. civil service district, 303 Postoffice building, Seattle, Washington.
