STOCKGROWERS TO BE ASKED TO USE PURE BRED SIRES

State College, Bozeman, Feb. 10.—County agents of Montana will be ready to issue, within the coming two weeks, blanks for the enrollment of farmers and stockgrowers in the national campaign for "Better Sires-Better Stock."

The campaign which has as its aim the enrollment of livestock men in the work of producing better grades of livestock, was started in the United States last October and is already returning interesting figures.

To each Montana farmer and stockgrower who enrolls in the campaign and thereby promises to use nothing but pure bred sires in the future, will be given an emblem, furnished jointly by the government and the state.

GREAT ACTIVITY IN STATE FARM LOANS

The report of Sidney Miller, registrar of state lands, covering the operations of the state land department during January shows that during the month named 55 farm loans were completed amounting to \$91,050.00.

The report shows that the cash on hand February 1 in the different permanent funds was \$297,742. Of this amount \$214,265.44 was in the common school fund, and the remainder in the various funds of the higher institutions of learning.
