Mystic Lake Plant

Huge Construction

The million dollar power plant at Mystic Lake in Stillwater county is one of the most commendable achievements credited to the Montana Power Company and this enterprise is an engineering feat that has no rival in the country.

This new plant, of three years construction, is one of the highest so-called "high head" plants in the Northwest.

The water is turned in from the intake at Mystic Lake and is sent hurtling through 9000 feet of wood-stave pipe line and hundreds of feet of steel pipe which feeds the water wheels at the plant. At the intake the pipe line is constructed through several hundred feet of solid granite rock and the water is stored to a depth of fifty feet before being fed at the entrance of the pipe line.

The water falls eleven hundred feet from the intake at Mystic Lake, at a distance of two miles from the power plant, to the tailrace of the plant.
