Sealed bids accompanied by a deposit of \$2500.00 for Unit A and/or \$600.00 for Unit B will be received by the State Forester, Missoula, Montana, up to 12:00 o'clock noon, February 7, 1948, for the merchantable sawtimber marked or designated for cutting on either one or both of the following described units:

UNIT A: An area of about 260 acres in Lots 1, 4, 5 and 8 Section 16, SE 1/4 SW 1/4, SE 1/4 SE 1/4 Section 22, T31N, R29W, and N 1/2 NE 1/4 Section 36, T32N, R29W, estimated to contain 247 M feet yellow pine and 1354 M feet larch and Douglas fir green sawtimber.

UNIT B: An area of about 60 acres in S 1/2 NW 1/4 Section 14, T31N, R29W, estimated to contain 5 M feet yellow pine and 285 M feet larch and Douglas fir green sawtimber.

The timber will be sold to the highest responsible bidder at a specified price per thousand feet board measure for the sawtimber and paid for in installments in advance of cutting, as specified in the contract. No bids will be accepted for less than \$8.00 per M feet for yellow pine, \$6.00 per M feet for larch and Douglas fir green sawtimber and \$1.00 per M feet for dead sawtimber.

When required by the State Forester, a deposit of \$1.00 per M feet for all green sawtimber cut shall be deposited with the State to defray the cost of brush disposal and timber stand improvement or planting.
