ZINC PRODUCTION IS UP IN MONTANA Helena, Feb. 24 (AP)—Zinc production in Montana was 42,775 tons in 1947, an increase of 155 per cent over the 1946 total and the highest production since 1942, according to a U. S. Bureau of Mines report received in Helena.

"Most large zinc-producing operations experienced declines in 1947, but the Anaconda Copper Mining Co. made a remarkable record at its Butte Hill mine and dumps," the Bureau said. "Zinc production in Montana was 42,775 tons in 1947, an increase of 155 per cent over the 1946 total and the highest production since 1942, according to a U. S. Bureau of Mines report received in Helena."

yield from this source was 58 times that in 1946." Among the remaining important producers, only the Emma and Travona mines reported increases, the Mines Bureau reported. The Butte Hill mine and dumps was the largest source of zinc in Montana, followed in order by the Emma, Mike Horse, and Poulin mines, east Helena slag-fluming plant, Toledo-Buckeye, and Travona mines. These seven producers contributed 97 per cent of the state total zinc, the government agency said.
