FAIR-CELEBRATION

(Continued from Page One) The high point on the Monday evening program was the awarding of the Libby Fire Department's three prizes. Mrs. Rudie Engle won first prize of \$500; second prize of \$200 going to Frank Luxa Jr. Mrs. Cornet won the \$100 prize. Music for Sunday night's street dance was furnished by Jimmy Zito's orchestra which played an engagement Saturday evening at Lincoln's Gopher Inn.

F. C. Robertson in discussing the grain and hay displays in his department, stated that this year saw better response than former years with better samples being shown. However a good representation of

what the county can produce in threshed grains was not shown. On account of our short growing seasons, this fall is the time to prepare exhibits for next year's fair. All the exhibits showed improvement over former years, with an especially fine floral show being made. The fine arts and dress good department had at least a half larger display than formerly. The display of livestock was good, but there is plenty more room for a much larger display in this department, though the quality of stock shown was good. The prize winners will be published in next week's Western News.

The address delivered Monday evening by Congressman Mike Mansfield, who is the democratic candidate for re-election to congress from this district, was a spirited attack against congress. He praised labor and while discussing dams in Montana, stated that Western Montana contains at least 10% of the potential water power in the United States. A resume of the representative's address written by

the union reporter, appears under a different heading in this issue. The annual event is showing a healthy growth in interest, and the fair exhibits have reached the point where a pavilion is said to be almost a necessity for future shows. Each year Libby citizens are becoming more fair-minded and already many are planning for the fair and celebration in 1949.
