NOTICE OF SALE OF SCHOOL DISTRICT BONDS

Notice is hereby given by the Board of Trustees of School District No. 4 of Lincoln County, State of Montana, that the said Board of Trustees will on the 15th day of December, 1948, at the hour of 8:00 o'clock p. m. at the Libby High School Building, in the said school district, sell to the highest and best bidder for cash, either amortization or serial bonds of the said district in the total amount of One-Hundred Sixty-five Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$165,000.00), for the purpose of constructing and equipping additional classrooms and other necessary additions to the New Central Building.

Amortization bonds will be the first choice and serial bonds will be the second choice of the said School Board.
If amortization bonds are sold and issued, the entire issue may be put into one single bond or divided into several bonds, as the said Board of Trustees may determine upon at the time of sale, both principal and interest to be payable in semi-annual installments during a period of twenty (20) years from the date of issue.

If serial bonds are issued and sold they will be in the amount of One Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$1,000.00) each, except the eighth bond and multiples thereof which will be in the amount of Twelve Hundred Fifty and 00/100 Dollars (\$1,250.00) the sum of Eight Thousand, Two Hundred Fifty and 00/100 Dollars (\$8,250.00) of the said serial bonds will become payable on the 15th day of January, 1950, and the sum of Eight Thousand, Two Hundred Fifty and 00/100 Dollars (\$8,250.00) will become payable on the same day each year thereafter until all of such bonds are paid.

The said bonds, whether amortization or serial bonds, will bear date of January 15, 1949, and will bear interest at a rate not exceeding six per centum (6%) per annum, payable semi-annually, on the 15th day of July and January in each year, and will be redeemable in full on any interest payment date from and after ten (10) years.
The said bonds will be sold for not less than their par value with accrued interest, and all bidders must state the lowest rate of interest at which they will purchase the bonds at par. The Board of Trustees reserves the right to reject any and all bids and to sell the said bonds at private sale.

All bids other than by or on behalf of the State Board of Land Commissioners must be accompanied by a certified check in the sum of Eight Thousand Two Hundred Fifty and 00/100 Dollars (\$8,250.00) payable to the order of the Clerk, which will be forfeited by the successful bidder in the event that he shall refuse to purchase the said bonds.

THANKSGIVING BIRD CROP LOW THIS YEAR; FEED PRICES LOWER

Montana's turkey crop is down this year, at least 15 per cent below the 1947 figure, according to P. J. Creer, statistician in charge of the Helena office of the Bureau of Agricultural Statistics.
There were approximately 101,000 Thanksgiving birds raised in the state this year, as compared with 119,000 in 1947. The 1946 crop totaled 170,000, which was still far below the 251,000 average of the 1935-1944 period. The nationwide picture also shows a decrease, with a total of 39,710,000 turkeys estimated for this year as against 35,105,000 in 1947.

How much will Mr. Average Citizen pay for his Thanksgiving turkey? The BAE won't even hazard a guess, but they point out that growers received 37 cents a pound live weight last October, 39 cents in November, and 44 cents in December. This September the price per pound live weight was 37 cents.

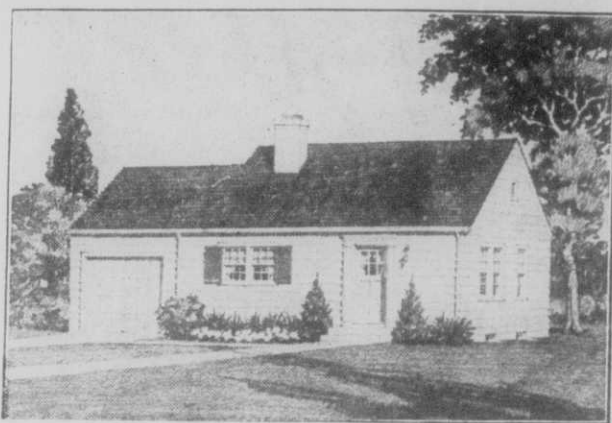
