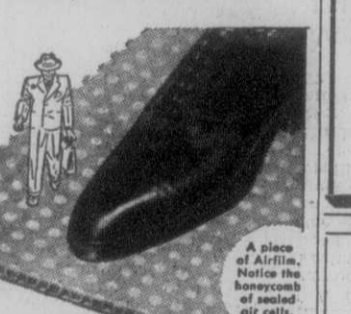

FAMED OLD MINE PRODUCING SOON

Drumlummon at Marysville Is Partnership Venture Montana Rainbow Mining company, a partnership owned by W. R. Wade, Betty Mae Anduiza and R. S. Rheem, which operates the Drumlummon mine, produced in the first seven months of 1948 6127.6 ounces of gold and 35,040.52 ounces of silver, with a value of \$250,000. Production ceased in August, 1948, due to the cave-in of ground adjoining No. 2 shaft, which wrecked the shaft. This cave-in was caused by old workings not shown by the old English company's maps, says Wade.

Montana, Ltd.) purchased the mine in 1876 from the late Thomas Cruse of Helena for \$1,500,000, and produced up to the time they ceased operations in 1905 \$28,000,000 at \$35 gold. This company was a substantial dividend payer, distributing over \$3,000,000.

The company has had a crew of men working repairing the shaft since August, and expect to resume production by March 1, 1949, for their 150-ton amalgamation-flotation mill.

In the last two years the company has discovered five new vein systems.

During the year 1948 the partners paid themselves an interim dividend. W. R. Wade is managing partner.—Spokesman-Review.
