Sealed bids will be received by the Forest Supervisor, Libby, Montana, up to 4:00 P. M., May 31, 1949, for all live timber marked or designated for cutting and all merchantable dead timber standing or down located on an area embracing about 12 acres within Section 8, T. 33 N., R. 33 W., M. P. M., Ferris Creek, Kootenai National Forest, Montana, estimated to be 300 cedar poles, 25,000 split cedar posts and an unestimated number of round cedar posts, more or less. No bid of less than 1c per lin. ft. for cedar poles 25' and under, 3c per lin. ft. for 30 and 35 foot cedar poles, 4c per lin. ft. for 40 and 45 foot cedar poles, 5c per lin. ft. for 50 and 55 foot cedar poles, 6c per lin. ft. for cedar poles 60' and over, 2c each for split cedar posts and 1/2c per lin. ft. for round cedar posts will be considered.
