NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION

Notice is hereby given, that on the 25th day of August, 1949, a special election will be held in the town of Eureka, Montana, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors for such election the question of whether or not the Town Council of the Town of Eureka shall be authorized to extend the three per cent (3%) limit of indebtedness fixed by Section 6 of Article XIII of the Constitution of the State of Montana and incur an additional indebtedness which, with all outstanding and unpaid indebtedness, will exceed three per cent (3%) of the value of taxable property in said town to be ascertained by the last assessment for state and county taxes previous to the incurring of such indebtedness and to issue and sell negotiable coupon bonds in the principal amount of Fifty-five thousand and no/100 Dollars (\$55,000.00) bearing interest at not to exceed six per cent (6%) per annum, payable semi-annually, such bonds to be either amortization or serial bonds, maturing over a period of twenty (20) years from date of issue thereof and subject to be redeemed in full, at the option of the town, on any interest payment date from and after five (5) years from the date of issue thereof, in order to procure a supply of water for the said town and for that purpose to construct improvements and replacements to the municipal waterworks system owned and controlled by the said town, including the replacement of wood pipe in the water distribution system with cast iron pipe and new wood pipe and including installation of necessary appurtenances, and devoting the net revenue derived from the said water supply and municipal waterworks system to the payment of the debt.

Only qualified registered electors of the town of Eureka whose names appear upon the last completed assessment roll for state and county taxes, as taxpayers upon property within said town, shall be entitled to vote at said election.

Polling places for such election will be:

- (1) The Public Library for Precinct Five (5);
- (2) The Town Hall for Precinct Six (6).

The polls will be kept open from ten o'clock A. M. until seven o'clock P. M. of said day.

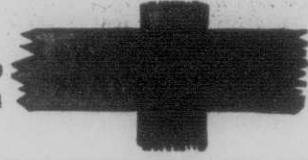
