EXAMINER'S COMMENTS		
Receipts and Disbursements for the period were checked and verified and with the exception of \$1.00, noted in the Reconciliation, the cash was accounted for, so far as we are concerned with the period covered by the examination. It was, however, found that in May, 1941, during Austin Fraser's term of office, certain Tax Deed Lands were sold to one Joseph Gussenhaven, and at the time of the purchase Mr. Gussenhaven issued his check for the full consideration of the lands he bought, namely \$432.13. According to the records only \$86.43 of this check was taken into account by the then County Treasurer, as evidenced by Receipt Form A104, Number 212. Mr. Fraser is now in Germany, being in the army, but it might be well for the Commissioners to instruct the County Attorney to file claim with Mr. Fraser's surety for \$349.80, being the difference between the check which Mr. Fraser received and the amount accounted for by him.
