HI-WAY COMMISSION WILL USE \$50,000 FOR TWO TOURIST PUBLICATIONS

Helena - (U.P.) - The Montana Highway Commission will use the \$50,000 appropriated annually during the next biennium by the 30th legislature to put out two tourist publications, according to an announcement here.

As a result, there are just two vast forces in today's world—one is the United States and the other is Soviet Russia. Mr. Truman did not speak the word Russia, but no one who heard his voice or read his words could doubt what was in his mind and the minds of Congress.

It is apparently the view of Mr. Truman and his advisors that the time for firmness can no longer be postponed—and "if" this involves great, calculated risks, that is a chance we must take.

Secretary Marshall enjoys an almost legendary reputation. In the view of many, he is the ablest man in American public life. There is none of the taint of the politician about him. When he took over, he shook up the Department from top to bottom.

The difficulties that lie ahead are again illustrated by the latest Moscow conference. Even the simplest questions involved interminable argument. The Soviet representatives are invariably the objectors. We are as far from a German-peace treaty as ever.

Invariably Russian spokesmen say that American "intervention" in the affairs of European nations such as Greece, is no different from Russian "intervention" in the affairs of nations such as Yugoslavia.

The dangers that face us are many. And the top danger, of course is the possibility of a third war which might destroy civilization and return the world to another dark age.

In the meantime, it is pleasant to record that the country still seems unified in basic foreign policy. A recent Gallup poll showed overwhelming sentiment in favor of resisting aggressive aims of Russia.
