most favorably located with respect to probable oil production. Oil and Gas Shows
The well now drilling, 1600 feet west of the surface crest of the anticline, found both oil and gas in shallow horizons. Drilling has received the formations to be absolutely regular, log of the Fulton-Blackfeet well checking perfectly with one drilled 25 miles north, in Canada. Near Possible Pay
This well is now near the base of the Colorado formation, with production possible inside of the next 400 feet of drilling. The hole is in perfect condition, cemented for its entire length below the bottom of the pipe. Location for the well was made by E. B. Emrick, geologist who discovered the Pondera and Banatyne fields in this state and who located the discovery wells

in these fields. The Milk River structure was first mapped by Stebbinger of the U. S. Geological Survey.
