

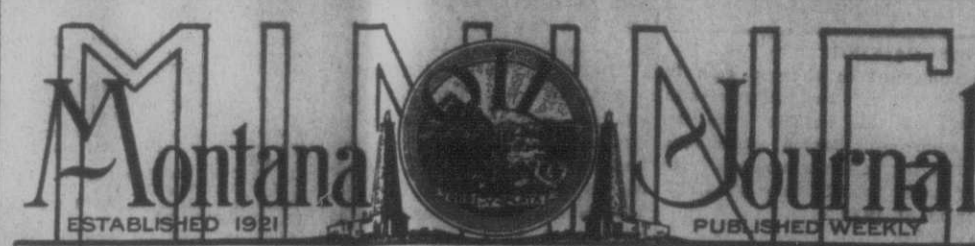
Gold Rush Is On In Beaverhead County

HELENA—Were the government to subsidize the mining industry, it will support 12.4 times as many people as agriculture, Dr. F. A. Thomson, president of the State Schol of Mines, declared in a talk before the Helena Chamber of Commerce.

COMSTOCK BUYS HALF INTEREST IN BASIN MINE

SAN FRANCISCO — Orlando McCraney, president of Comstock Gold Pont Mining company, announced today his company has acquired a half interest in the Jib mine of Basin, Mont. The mine produces gold, silver, copper and zinc, with gold accounting for about 70 percent of the production values.

OUTLOOK FOR SILVER BILL IS PROMISING

WASHINGTON—Silver re-monetization advocates have united their efforts on the modified Dies silver farm relief bill which will allow the use of silver for the purchase of surplus farm products for export. It has been amended by Senator Thomas of Oklahoma to authorize the secretary of the treasury to take title to all domestic silver and pay for the metal with silver certificates issued against the silver on a basis of \$1.29 per ounce.

MINERS ARE WORSTED Landusky—Miners who objected to allowing breed children to attend public schools were worsted in the recent school election when the opposing ranchers won out, by four votes. Last year the miners elected one trustee but failed to get control by 11 votes.

MAY EXEMPT MINERS Modification of the securities regulation act so that western mining projects can finance with less difficulty has been proposed by representatives of western states in congress.

MINERS DISPUTE LEASE

Conflicting claims of miners for mineral prospecting leases on Ruby creek, 20 miles southwest of Virginia City, were decided by the state board which granted James E. McLeod and his partner, Peter Marek, of Butte, a permit to prospect for placer gold along the creek bed and a general prospecting permit away from the creek bed was granted William J. Tonkin of Butte, Frank Daems of Varnery, J. W. Farrell of Butte and Edward L. McAtee of Cameron. The state reserved the right to issue a mill site lease in the area, and reserved 10% royalty on all production.

New hoisting and pumping machinery has been installed and preparations are being made to run lateral drifts on the ore body.

BARUCH MAY GIVE WINGFIELD "STAKE"

Back in 1906, Barney Baruch, New York capitalist, loaned \$1,000,000 to a cowboy named George Wingfield who had some mining properties which needed money for development. Baruch was paid back the million plus interest, plus \$160,000 bonus plus a present of 200,000 shares of stock valued at \$10 per share.

George Wingfield, former millionaire mining man, is today "busted" because he went into the banking business in a big way. It is reported that he has gone back to Baruch for another "grubstake", with which to resume work on his mining properties.

On the strength of the rumor, shares of Goldfield Consolidated Mines Co. jumped in price on the San Francisco mining exchange.

WALL STREET WAILS

For many years past, Wall Street has been trying to get a national blue sky act passed to "put a crimp" in western industry. The federal blue sky law was finally passed, under the stress of the "new deal" and none is crying louder than Wall Street. Even the Chamber of Commerce of the United States is among those who have sounded a loud wail. The liability clause, they claim, is too drastic.
