WILL EXPLAIN GASOLINE PRICE CHANGES

Standard of New Jersey has adopted a new policy in connection with price adjustments. A statement of reasons that have made price adjustments necessary will be made. The policy is based on the grounds that "people are interested in and have a right to know what makes the things they buy cost what they do."

J. T. Sykes of Kalspell is establishing a new oil business in Livingston as dealer for Socony-Vacuum products, Mobilgas and Mobiloil. Workmen are busy on construction of a retail sales station on Park street at H street, and the old Community Gas station at Park and 11th has been purchased as a second station.

ELIMINATE CONSUMERS TANKWAGON PRICE

Continental Oil company has taken one step in solution of the problem of co-ops in the maintenance of the price structure in Montana by elimination of the consumers tank wagon price which was two cents under the dealers' price.

REGISTRATION OF HOME IS COMPLETE

Reports from the Securities & Exchange commission at Washington, D. C., show that amendments have been filed by Home Oil & Refining Co., in compliance with the revised list of properties following the withdrawal of A. B. Cobb, and it is understood that the federal issuance of the securities can now proceed, meaning an early completion of the deal whereby the Home refinery will have acquired its own producing properties and in addition to properties in Pondera field owned by W. E. Rice.

ALBERTA CRUDE PRICE CUT

Confirmation of reports of a cut in the price of crude in Turner Valley field was received this week from Calgary. The price was cut 19 cents per barrel from \$1.70. This results from the over-production situation and is intended to curb further drilling until new market outlets can be established.

RETURN TO CALIFORNIA

Ed Murray, Mrs. Murray and son David together with Miss Katie Murray, a sister, left Billings, for Los Angeles, after a months stay in Montana. Mr. Murray is connected with Broadview Dome Oil Development, now drilling 35 miles northwest of Billings.

NEW LEASE FORM BEING PREPARED BY INDIAN OFFICE

A new lease form is being prepared by the Indian office at Browning, for use in future leasing of oil leads owned by the Blackfeet Indians. The old oil and gas lease form was not entirely satisfactory and the office is working on a new form which will be used in the issuance of leases on the 17 tracts which are to be sold at public auction next Saturday.

One change is that the leases will not require drilling to the Madison line, in every instance. This was formerly provided although it was a useless expense, since no formation below the Cut Bank has ever produced any oil on the reservation.

Bidders will hereafter make checks payable to the Treasurer, Blackfeet Tribe, rather than to the Superintendent as heretofore.

Test of Security Petroleum Corporation of Great Falls on Genou structure, in the central Sweetgrass Arch, NE 1/4 NE 1/4 23-26N-3E, is drilling at 1565 feet, making good progress. Drillers are Harvey Bailey, Norman Appley and Tom Jones. Toolbits are Haugen, Kelly and Lyons.

DRILLING AT LUTHER

Drilling is again under way at the R. C. Tarrant test on Luther-Fox dome, near Red Lodge, after delays occasioned by a caving hole. The hole had reached 800 when it was found that it was slightly off center so it was bridged back and re-drilled and it is now drilling ahead with straight hole at around 1,000 feet.
