

# Gage Dome

Gage Dome activity remained at a virtual standstill this week, with no new wells started and with production of approximately 100 barrels daily recorded from the pinched-in producers.

Fishing is still in progress for 30 feet of stuck tubing in the discovery well, Carter-Northern Ordinance-Morris No. 1.

The field's most recent completion, Northern Ordinance-L. T. Morris A-1, has been acidized several times and is standing with hole full of oil, to be swabbed.
