TO AVOID CREPE GET RID OF FLIES

Annual "Swat the Fly" Campaign" Now on in Butte. Advice is Given.

"A yard of screen on the window is better than a yard of crepe on the door." The above slogan has been adopted by the Butte health department, already started on its campaign against the house fly. All Butte is asked to co-operate for the extermination of the pest that takes away so many lives in the United States.

The following statement was issued from the health office this morning: "Butte is at the threshold of another clean-up season. The campaign will be carried through the entire summer. Ninety per cent of all flies are hatched in stables where horses are kept. Clean stables will mean a big step toward the extermination of the house fly.

"Fighting the fly in the home, either by swatting or poisoning, is regarded as last trench fighting. If the preliminary work is done—and it should be done now—there will be but little work left for the housewives in keeping their homes rid of the pests.

"People who refuse to enlist in this war against flies are enemies to themselves, to their children and to their neighbors. A fly is the sign of death."
