### FRENCH GOVERNMENT WILL NOT FACILITATE DELEGATES' JOURNEY

Paris, June 1.—Premier Ribot today announced in the French chamber of deputies that the government would not facilitate the voyage of the French socialists to the international socialist congress at Stockholm.  
Resuming consideration of the bill which provides for a food survey and stimulation of production, the senate today took up for discussion Senator Fletcher's amendment to permit the secretary of commerce to promote wider use of fish to meet the food stringency. The proposal has the endorsement of the administration.  
Work of perfecting the bill to authorize a food administration and price fixing, second of the government's measures, was continued today by the house agricultural committee.
