London, June 2.—The arrest of Grand Duke Nicholas, former commander-in-chief of the Russian armies, in consequence of royalist riots at Tiflis, is reported in an Exchange Telegraph dispatch quoting advices from Petrograd.

London June 2.—A Petrograd dispatch to Reuter's says that a few score anarchists, accompanied by some soldiers and sailors, marched through the Navy and other thoroughfares at mid-day on Friday, carrying black banners inscribed: "Down With Authority," "Down With Capitalists," "Long Live the Social Revolution and the Commune." They were armed with rifles, revolvers, daggers and grenades.

TO STRAIGHTEN OUT KRONSTADT TROUBLE

Petrograd (via London), June 2.—A delegation from the Kronstadt council of Soldiers' and Workmen's delegates has arrived here and been received by a committee from the Petrograd council. Although declaring themselves in agreement with the Petrograd body, the report of the Kronstadt delegation indicates that they do not fully comprehend the relations between the government and the Petrograd council.

UNPRECEDENTED WORK OF SUBMARINE CRAFT

French Sub Torpedoed Enemy U-Boat—Two Subs Collide Under Sea.

Rome, Friday, June 1 (via Paris, Rome 2).—The French submarine Circe has torpedoed and sunk a large enemy submarine as it was coming out from Cattaro. Although attacked by airplanes, the Circe returned under undamaged to its base.

IN COLLISION

Amsterdam, June 2.—A collision under water between a British submarine and a German U-boat is reported by the Rheinische Westfälische Zeitung of Essen, which describes the incident as unprecedented. The paper states that the collision took place "in the channel," April 19, and declares that a German U-boat while submerged rammed a British submarine and that the British boat then emerged, bringing up the German submarine lying across the bow of the British vessel.

TUESDAY TO BE HOLIDAY; EVERY OPPORTUNITY IS GIVEN FOR REGISTRATION

Business Will Be Suspended, Mines Will Be Down, Public Offices Closed and Schools Will Suspend While Butte Gives Itself Up to the Business of Enrolling Eligibles for Select Service Draft. All Married Men Not Exempt, Declares the Provost Marshal General.

713 AIRCRAFT SHOT DOWN IN MONTH OF MAY

London, June 2.—The morning papers figure that 713 airplanes were shot down on the western front in May, of which 442 were German and 271 British and French. The total losses in April were estimated at 709.

CANNOT GO TO JAIL TO AVOID SERVICE UNDER DRAFT LAW

Washington, June 2.—In an official announcement today Attorney General Gregory directed attention to the provision of the army draft law which provides that no man can choose imprisonment as a substitute for registration, but will suffer the first and be compelled to do the latter if he resists. "It has come to the notice of the department," said the attorney general, "that certain disloyal citizens who are themselves beyond the conscription age are suggesting to the younger men of the country that it is better to suffer imprisonment under the terms of the conscription act than to register with the likelihood of being enlisted and compelled to serve at the front."

BLACKFEET INDIANS OPPOSED TO DRAFT

C., June 2.—Senator Bray of Idaho was informed in a telegram from a committee of three citizens of Blackfoot, Idaho, today that a serious uprising of Blackfoot Indians against conscription is threatened and it is feared that the same condition may spread to other Indian reservations.

HINDENBURG DECLARES BIG ALLIED OFFENSIVE HAS COME TO AN END

Berlin, June 2 (via London).—The French and British offensive on the western front has come to a definite conclusion, according to a report from Field Marshal Hindenburg to Emperor William. Official announcement is made that the emperor has sent the following message to the German people: "The taking of more than 12,700 prisoners on the Franco-Belgian front during May, together with three guns, 211 machine guns and other war material, is claimed in the German official statement."

ALLEGED FOUL PLOT TO CRIPPLE FOOD SUPPLY

Honolulu, T. H., June 2.—Federal authorities here were investigating today the theory of Dr. Victor Norgaard that an inoculation plot with a deliberate intent to destroy the cattle industry of Hawaii and thus reduce the food supply was the cause for the recent outbreak of anthrax, which resulted in the death of 23 cows in two days.

MAN CONDEMNED BY JURY TO DEATH WILL HANG JULY 23

Sherman A. Powell, Colored, Slayer of J. H. Montgomery, Appears Cool When Sentence is Imposed and Tells Judge He Has Nothing to Say. Sherman A. Powell, the colored man who shot and killed J. H. Montgomery and who was found guilty of murder in the first degree and sentenced by the jury to suffer the death penalty, is to be executed in the jail yard on July 23. Powell appeared before Judge John V. Dwyer this morning to have the formal sentence of death imposed. He seemed to be perfectly cool and in reply to the question propounded by the judge he answered that he had nothing to say why sentence should not be imposed.

BUTTER AND EGG BOARD STOPS "FUTURE" TRADE

Chicago, June 2.—Directors of the Chicago butter and egg board, it was learned today, have prohibited further trading in futures, giving as a reason their desire to help the government as patriotic citizens.

CONFERENCE AGREES ON THE WAR BUDGET BILL

Washington, June 2.—The three billion dollar war budget, including provision for \$75,000,000 for an American merchant marine, was today completed by the senate and house conferees, who reached an agreement on all questions. The shipping legislation was amended so the government will direct and be responsible for the acquisition of the merchant vessels, but specifying that the emergency fleet corporation, headed by General Goethals, as well as the government shipping board, must be used in the work.

NATIONWIDE SEARCH FOR KIDNAPED BABE

Springfield, Mo., June 2.—A nationwide search for Lloyd Keet, the 18-month-old boy kidnaped from his parents' home three days ago, began today. Pictures of the child have been sent to all parts of the country by his father, J. H. Keet, a local banker. Reports from Kansas City today cleared a man who is said to have been sought for alleged connection with the abduction. He reported to the police there and was cleared of suspicion. His activities in regard to an abduction 13 years ago caused the authorities to look for him after the Keet baby disappeared.
