PHONE TROUBLE BEFORE FEDERAL LABOR MEDIATOR

Secretary Wilson and His Associates Deal With the Coast Strike.

San Francisco, Nov. 12.—Answer of the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph company to demands of its organized electrical workers and telephone operators will be presented to the president's mediation commission, headed by Secretary of Labor William B. Wilson, late today, it was announced. The employees' demands of a dollar a day increase for electrical workers, closed shop conditions and recognition of the operators' union, were refused by the company, which made a counter proposition offering an increase of 50 cents a day. This was rejected in a referendum in a vote.

MILLION IS RAISED IN LIBRARY DRIVE

Carnegie Corporation With \$320,000 is Largest Contributor.

The million dollar library drive which was started throughout the United States two months ago to supply books for Uncle Sam's soldiers in the cantonments and at the war front in France has been successful, according to advices received today by Miss Gertrude Nichols, librarian of the Butte library. These advices state that more than \$1,400,000 has been raised with subscriptions still coming in.

The largest single donation was from the Carnegie corporation, the grant of this organization being \$320,000 to be used for adequate buildings in each of the cantonments throughout the country. With the exception of Kalispell, Havre and a few smaller cities, Montana did not take part in the drive. The trustees of the Butte library decided the time inopportune and for this reason all efforts to raise subscriptions in this city were abandoned.

STATE TEACHERS MAY MEET HERE

Helena Schedule is Cancelled. Butte is Being Considered.

The annual meeting of the Montana State Teachers' association may be held in Butte, Nov. 26, 27 and 28, instead of at Helena, on account of the epidemic of scarlet fever in the capital city. This was announced this afternoon. Superintendent of Schools W. E. Maddock was called over the long distance telephone yesterday and this afternoon he had practically decided that it would be possible to have the meeting here and so advised the headquarters in Helena by telephone, but there are some arrangements to be settled yet.

RECREATION FUND DRIVE TO BEGIN

Will Commence in States West of Rocky Mountains on Nov. 26.

San Francisco, Nov. 12.—Throughout the western states the great drive in the interest of the war camp community recreation fund, known as the "Spirit of America Fund," will begin generally the week of Nov. 26. It was announced today by the committee in charge of the campaign for the district west of the Rocky mountains.

The nation has been asked to contribute \$4,000,000, of which California's share is \$172,000. Other states have been assigned quotas based on population. Interest in the fund, campaign managers pointed out, has been shown by the fact that although the drive will not formally begin for more than two weeks, many cities have already pledged their quotas during the last week, among them being Seattle, Sacramento, Los Angeles and Fresno. Great Falls, Mont., raised \$2,200 in three days, doubling its quota, it was announced.

John Clausen, vice president of the Crocker National bank here, will lead the San Francisco campaign to raise \$50,000 for the fund, which is primarily to fight vice and homesickness in any army posts and training camps, and to finance an aggressive recreation program for soldiers and sailors.

OPERATIONS RESUMED AT THE NEVERSWEAT
