hurst says in his letter that his efforts to lower prices have been nullified through "a lack of intelligent cooperation and assistance" given him by the United States fuel administration.

The car shortage in the coal business is due principally to the war. Chairman A. Von Eschenhausen of the Silver Bow county fuel committee has been informed by a railroad official that freight cars are sending 500 cars east every 24 hours in handling munitions and food for the allies.

Complaints of car shortage are coming from all the coal fields which supply the Montana district.

Miners Idle. "The mines of this district were idle 91 hours last week," says a wire from the Bear Creek field.

Wyo. district complains: "On account of the inadequate car supply we have operated our mines less than 50 per cent time for the past six weeks, and for the month of October have produced less than 20 per cent maximum tonnage."

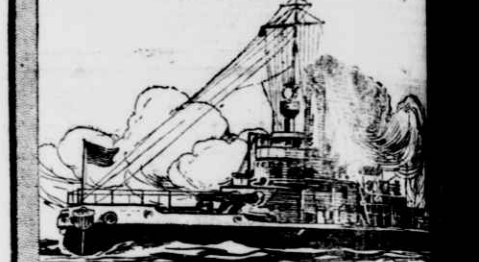
Helena has reported to State Fuel Administrator Swindlehurst that there is only enough coal in the capital city to last three days in case of a sudden cold spell.

Dr. Garfield, federal fuel administrator, comes in for a scolding criticism by State Fuel Administrator Swindlehurst in a letter to Chairman McIntyre of the Yellowstone county fuel committee.

Swindlehurst's Letter. "Under the first order issued by the federal fuel administrator," says Mr. Swindlehurst in his letter, "operators in this state found it more profitable to produce and ship run of mine coal than prepared sizes. As I anticipated, the new regulations, allowing \$4.95 for run of mine and \$1.95 for prepared sizes, has resulted in a larger profit to the mine operators than prepared sizes than run of mine."

with the fixing of prices of coal at the mine in this state and for the further reason that I know of no ruling or order issued by Dr. Garfield, which would give me authority to compel the mines to ship run of mine in preference to prepared sizes of coal, it would appear that I am powerless to intervene and give any relief in this matter.

On Oct. 10, I telegraphed Mr. Garfield that the government should define product by screen sizes with lump coal over not less than six-inch screen and not sizes with prices correspondingly less than mine run and that price of \$4.95 should cover only lump coal over six-inch screen.
