ITALIANS AGAIN HURL INVADING FORCES BACK

Teutonic Army is Compelled to Retreat in Disorder After a New Attack on Upper Piave Defenses. Little Infantry Activity in France.

THE WAR SUMMARY. Except on the short stretch between the Brenta and Piave rivers there has been no marked activity on the front from the North sea to the Adriatic.

TEUTON FORCES ARE DRIVEN BACK IN DISORDER

Rome, Dec. 17.—Austro-German forces which attacked the Italian lines on the northern front from the direction of San Marino were driven back in disorder, the war office announced today.

BRITISH ATTACK ON THE ITALIAN FRONT

Berlin, Dec. 17 (via London).—British troops on the Italian front yesterday launched an attack against the Austro-German lines south of Monte Fontana Secca, but it broke down before the Teuton positions, the German war office announced today.
