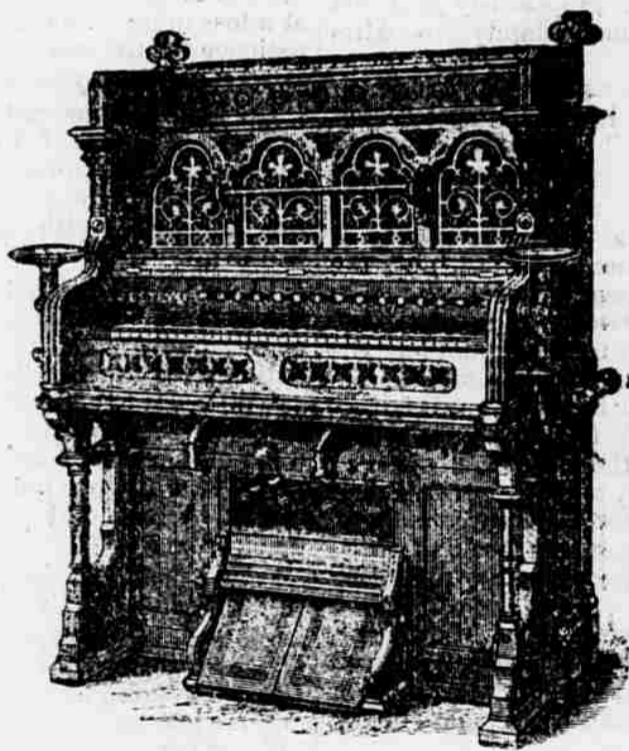

## GENERAL NEWS.

DR. MARY WALKER is going to reside in England, and the Boston Courier thinks she ought to take up her residence in Middlesex.

Moody and Sankey have gone to a foreign shore to spread the gospel and subdue the unconverted. They will at first devote a couple of weeks to the south of Ireland, and then take in London in the prosecution of their labors.

MR. VANDERBILT handed in his personal check the other day in New York for \$190,000 in payment of his taxes for the year. He proposes to get even by watering the stock of some of the half a dozen roads which he controls.

A CORRESPONDENT who saw Alfonso, the Spanish king, at Hamburg, says he is an insipid little creature, who is given to cigarettes and garlic. He loves to drive out behind fine horses, and is evidently under the impression that the people are anxious to see him.

THE university of Edinburgh is soon to celebrate the 30th anniversary of its establishment. The occasion will be commemorated by the expenditure of £30,000 on new buildings for the medical school, on which nearly £200,000 has been spent the last ten years.

R. C. CORNWELL of Crete, a teacher by profession, has disappeared from that place, after embezzling a large sum of money. A reward is offered for Cornwell's arrest and detection. Cornwell is about fifty years old, and when he left Crete had a long dark beard and moustache. He has a dark complexion, with dark hair and dark eyes, and is about five feet six inches tall.

THE head brakemen on one of the Plattsmouth bridge division crews had a very narrow escape the other morning. As the train was coming this way through the cut he attempted to step from the top of one box-car to another, and missing his foothold he fell between the cars, striking in such a manner on the couplings as to bounce off beyond the reach of the rapidly running car wheels.—Bee.

A SYNDICATE of Cleveland capitalists has purchased the Denver, Utah & Pacific railroad for \$250,000 in cash and \$600,000 in first mortgage bonds, equal to \$20,000 per mile. The first move made by the new owners will be to thoroughly equip the road. An effort will be made to have trains enter and depart from the Union depot in Denver, and commence running passenger trains to Longmont and Boulder. Next year it is proposed to push the extension of the road as originally laid out, and to connect with the Greeley, Longmont & Western road and build as far north as Wyoming. It is thought the local traffic on this road will more than pay good interest on the first cost.

MR. EVARTS has returned home delighted with the Northern Pacific and the empire which is tributary to it. He finds that it commands an unmatchable bread-producing area; that it is 500 miles nearer China from New York than any other through road, and that all the Northern harbors are good. This is all good, says the Salt Lake Tribune, but the route is not remarkable in that way.

Its chief advantage is that along nearly the whole length of the road there are places for homes, where people can make a good living and still as a mass not become too rich. Throughout most of the route of the Northern Pacific there are not going to be many very rich men and very few very poor men. This is the best feature of that region, for that means thousands of prosperous and contented families and comfortable if not too elegant homes.
